

How do you tighten a battery terminal?

If your terminals require a screwdriver, turn the connecting screw clockwise until the terminal is snug against the battery post. Remember to not overtighten, as this may damage the battery post or terminal. After tightening the terminals, a thorough inspection is necessary.
